- the legal responsibility to make decisions has been delegated by the people to boards of education, state education authorities, and local education authorities.

c. The association shall work to promote the health and welfare of children
 and youth and shall seek to promote collaboration between parents,

schools, and the community at large.

d.No part of the net earnings of the association shall inure to the benefit of,
or be distributable to its members, directors, trustees, officers, or other
private persons except that the association shall be authorized and
empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to
make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in
Article II hereof.

e.Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the association shall
 not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (i) by an

association exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the
 Internal Revenue Code or (ii) by an association, contributions to which are
 deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code.

f. Upon the dissolution of this association, after paying or adequately
providing for the debts and obligations of the association, the remaining
assets shall be distributed to one (1) or more nonprofit funds, foundations,
or associations that have established their tax-exempt status under Section
501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and whose purposes are in
accordance with those of the National PTA; and

g.The association or members in their official capacities shall not, directly or
 indirectly, participate or intervene (in any way, including the publishing or
 distributing of statements) in any political campaign on behalf of, or in
 opposition to, any candidate for public office; or devote more than an
 insubstantial part of its activities to attempting to influence legislation by
 propaganda or otherwise.

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#### **ARTICLE IV: CONSTITUENT ASSOCIATIONS**

- 71 Section 1. The constituent associations of National PTA include:
- a. Branches of National PTA that have been established in the 50 states of the
- <sup>73</sup> United States, the District of Columbia, the U.S. Virgin Islands, Puerto

- Rico and among schools for American dependents in, Europe and the
  Pacific hereinafter called state PTAs;
- b.Local PTAs (Parent Teacher Associations) or PTSAs (Parent Teacher
   Student Associations) organized under the authority of the state PTA in
   organized areas; and
- c.Local PTAs/PTSAs organized under the direct authority of National PTA
   when there is no state PTA/PTSA.
- 81 Section 2. The national Board of Directors shall determine criteria for 82 establishing constituent associations and setting standards for continuing 83 affiliation with National PTA.
- Section 3. There shall be no proxy voting by any constituent association of
   National PTA.
- 86 Section 4. The purposes and basic policies of National PTA shall in every
- case also be the purposes and basic policies of each constituent association.
- 88 Section 5. The articles of association of a constituent association include (a)
- the bylaws of such association and (b) articles of incorporation of such association (in cases in which the association is incorporated) or the articles
- association (in cases in which the association is incorporated) or the articles
   of association by whatever name (in cases in which the association exists as
   an unincorporated association).
- Section 6. Each constituent association shall adopt such bylaws for the
  government of the association as may be approved by the Georgia PTA.
  Such bylaws shall not be in conflict with the National PTA Bylaws or the
  bylaws of the state PTA.
- Section 7. Each officer or board member of a constituent association shall
  be a member of a local PTA/PTSA within its area.
- 99 Section 8. A PTA member shall not serve as a voting member of a 100 constituent association's board at the local, council or district level while 101 serving as a paid employee of, or under contract to, that constituent 102 association.
- Section 9. Bylaws of each constituent association shall include a provision
   establishing a quorum.
- 105 Section 10. The members of the nominating committee for officers of a
- 106 constituent association must be a member of that association and shall be
- 107 elected by the general membership, except as provided for in Article
- 108 VIII, Section 7 of these bylaws.
- Section 11. The bylaws of all constituent associations shall prohibit voting
  by proxy.

Section 12. Dissolution. Upon the dissolution of a state constituent association, after paying or adequately providing for the debts and obligations of the association, the state constituent association's financial holdings, property, all records and all remaining assets shall be distributed to National PTA in order to establish a new entity to service the state membership.

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#### **ARTICLE V: STATE PTAs/PTSAs**

Section 1. The Georgia PTA is a branch of the National PTA and exists for the purpose of accomplishing, at the state level, the purposes of the National PTA in accordance with its policies. Within the framework of the responsibility that it shares with the National PTA for the implementation of the purposes of the National PTA and its obligation to comply with the National PTA Bylaws, the Georgia PTA is a self-governing association with independent legal existence.

- Section 2. The relationship of the Georgia PTA with the National PTA and
  its duties, obligations, and responsibilities are set forth in the National PTA
  Bylaws and in the charter that is issued by the National PTA to the Georgia
  PTA.
- Section 3. The Georgia PTA shall adopt such bylaws and other articles of
   association as are in conformity with the National PTA Bylaws.
- Section 4. The adoption of an amendment to any provision of the National
  PTA Bylaws shall serve automatically and without requirement of further
  action of the Georgia PTA to amend its corresponding bylaws.
  Notwithstanding the automatic character of the amending process, the
  Georgia PTA shall promptly incorporate such amendments in its bylaws.
- Section 5. The bylaws of the Georgia PTA and all amendments or a revision
  hereto, adopted by the convention delegates, shall be submitted to National
  PTA.
- Section 6. The Georgia PTA shall provide appropriate procedures for the association of local PTAs/PTSAs within Georgia and prescribe the form and
- 143 content of the bylaws or other articles of association of such local
- 144 PTAs/PTSAs.
- 145 **Section 7.** The Georgia PTA may create or establish subsidiary associations 146 (district) within its area to facilitate the administration of the affairs of the

Georgia PTA and for carrying out its programs and may prescribe the form
and content of the bylaws or other articles of association of such districts.

149 Section 8. The Georgia PTA may create or establish councils in counties,

cities, or other areas designated by its Board of Directors for the purpose of conference, leadership training, and coordination of the efforts of local

152 PTAs/PTSAs and may prescribe the form and content of the bylaws or other

articles of association of such councils. The local PTAs/PTSAs that shall be

- eligible for membership and participation in the work of any council shall be
   determined by the Georgia PTA. Councils shall not legislate for local
   PTAs/PTSAs.
- 157 Section 9. In the event of surrender or withdrawal of its charter by the
- <sup>158</sup> National PTA, in the manner provided in Article XIX of the National PTA
- 159 Bylaws, the Georgia PTA is obligated:
- a. To yield up and surrender all of its books and records and all of its assets
   and property to the National PTA or to such agency as may be designated
   by the National PTA to be held for the benefit of another branch
   association established by the National PTA for the area of the Georgia
   PTA.
- b.To yield up all of the books and records and all of the assets and property 165 of any Controlled Association and surrender them to the National PTA or 166 to such agency as may be designated by the National PTA to be held for 167 the benefit of another branch association established by the National PTA 168 for the area of such state PTA. A Controlled Association shall mean any 169 corporation or other entity, whether nonprofit or for-profit, incorporated or 170 unincorporated, that is controlled by such state PTA. For purposes of this 171 section, control means ownership by vote or value of more than fifty 172 percent of the association, power to appoint individuals to the governing 173 body of the association representing more than fifty percent of the voting 174 power, or ownership of more than fifty percent of the beneficial interests in 175 the association. The state PTA shall cause the governing documents of the 176 Controlled Association to reflect this obligation. 177
- c. To cease and desist from the further use of any name that implies or
   connotes association or affiliation with the National PTA or status as a
   branch or constituent association of the National PTA; and
- d.To carry out promptly, under the supervision and direction of the National PTA, all proceedings necessary or desirable for the purpose of dissolving

the Georgia PTA.

Section 10. The Georgia PTA is responsible for compliance by the local, 184 council, and district PTAs within its area with the National PTA Bylaws and 185 the bylaws of the state PTA. The provisions of the Georgia PTA Bylaws 186 relating to the withdrawal of the charter of a local PTA/PTSA (and the 187 termination of its status as a local PTA/PTSA) shall parallel the provisions of 188 the National PTA Bylaws relation to the withdrawal by the National PTA of 189 the charter of the Georgia PTA and the termination of the status of the 190 Georgia PTA as a branch of the National PTA. 191

Section 11. The Georgia PTA shall comply with all criteria set forth in the
 National PTA Policy – Standards of Affiliation.

Section 12. The Georgia PTA shall keep such permanent books of account 194 and records as shall be sufficient to establish the items of gross income, 195 receipts, and disbursements of the association, including, specifically, the 196 number of local PTAs/PTSAs within its area, the national portion of 197 membership dues collected by such local PTAs/PTSAs, the amounts of such 198 dues received by the Georgia PTA, and the amounts of dues remitted to the 199 Such books of account and records, including those of National PTA. 200 controlled associations, shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection by 201 an authorized representative of the National PTA. 202

## **ARTICLE VI: LOCAL PTAs/PTSAs**

Section 1. Local PTAs/PTSAs shall be organized and chartered under the authority of the Georgia PTA in the area in which the local PTA/PTSA functions, in conformity with such rules and regulations, not in conflict with the National PTA Bylaws, as the Georgia PTA may in its bylaws prescribe. The Georgia PTA shall issue to each local PTA/PTSA in its area an appropriate charter evidencing the due association and good standing of the local PTA/PTSA. A local PTA/PTSA in good standing is one that:

a. Adheres to the purposes and basic policies of the PTA.

b. Remits the state and national portion of the dues, on a monthly basis, to the
state PTA. The state shall remit the national portion to reach the national
office by dates designated by the National PTA.

c. Has bylaws approved according to the procedures of each state.

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- d. Submits an annual audit report to the state office by the last business day of September.
- e. Shall submit annually to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), the appropriate Form 990 by the applicable IRS due date; and
- f. Shall pay annual membership dues as assessed by the affiliate council PTA
   per Article VI, Section 5 of council bylaws, if applicable.
- 227 Section 2. Each local association in good standing shall be entitled to be 228 represented at the annual state convention by its president and one (1) other 229 officer, or their alternates, and one (1) delegate for every fifty (50) paid 230 members recorded in the state office on the statistical report generated as of 231 the (10<sup>th</sup>) day of March each year.
- 232 Section 3. Each local PTA/PTSA shall keep such permanent books of 233 account and records:
- a. Sufficient to establish the items of gross income, receipts, and
   disbursements of the association.
- b. Specifically including the number of its members, the dues collected from
  its members and the amounts of dues remitted to
- the Georgia PTA; and
- c. Such books of account and records shall at all reasonable times be open to
   inspection by an authorized representative of the Georgia PTA or by a duly
   authorized representative of the National PTA.
- Section 4. The charter of a local PTA/PTSA shall be subject to withdrawal and the status of such association as a local PTA/PTSA shall be subject to termination, in the manner and under the circumstances provided by the bylaws of the Georgia PTA.
- 246 Section 5. Each local PTA/PTSA is obligated, upon withdrawal of its 247 charter by the Georgia PTA:
- a. To yield up and surrender all of its books and records and all of its assets
   and property to the Georgia PTA or to such agency as may be designated
   by the Georgia PTA or to another local PTA/PTSA organized under the
- authority of the Georgia PTA.
- b. To cease and desist from the further use of any name that implies or
  connotes association with the National PTA or the Georgia PTA or status
  as a constituent association of the National PTA; and
- c. To carry out promptly, under the supervision and direction of the Georgia
   PTA, all proceedings necessary or desirable for the purpose of dissolving
   such local PTA/PTSA.

- 258 Section 6. Each officer or board member of a local PTA/PTSA shall be a 259 member of such local PTA/PTSA.
- <sup>260</sup> #Section 7. The Georgia PTA shall determine the fiscal/membership year
- <sup>261</sup> for the local PTAs/PTSAs within Georgia. Only members of a local <sup>262</sup> PTA/PTSA who have paid dues for the current membership year may
- 263 participate in the business of the local PTA/PTSA.
- 264 Section 8. Each local PTA/PTSA shall collect dues from its members and
- shall remit a portion of such dues to the Georgia PTA as provided in Article
- VII hereof.
- 267 Section 9. The Georgia PTA does not allow family memberships or tiered 268 membership dues.
- 269 Section 10. Each local PTA/PTSA shall include in its bylaws provisions
- corresponding to the provisions of the Georgia PTA Bylaws identified by a
  number symbol.
- 272 Section 11. The adoption of an amendment to any provision of these bylaws
- identified by a number symbol shall automatically amend the bylaws of the
- local PTAs/PTSAs to conform to the action taken by the state convention.
- 275 Section 12. Amendments to Bylaws:
- a. Local PTA/PTSA bylaws may be amended at any regular meeting of the
  association by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present and voting
  provided that notice of the proposed amendment shall have been given at
  least thirty (30) days prior to the meeting of the local unit and that the
  amendment shall be subject to approval of the Georgia PTA.
- b. The amendment shall become effective upon receipt of approval from the
   Georgia PTA; and
- c. In the event that a revised set of bylaws is required by the Georgia PTA
   and there are no changes in the local unit information stated in the current
   bylaws, the thirty (30) day waiting period is waived.
- 286 Section 13. The bylaws of each constituent association shall include an 287 article stating the fiscal year.
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**ARTICLE VII: MEMBERSHIP AND DUES** 

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# 291 Section I. Every individual who is a member of a local PTA/PTSA is, by 292 virtue of that fact, a member of the National PTA and of the Georgia PTA by

- which such local PTA/PTSA is chartered and is entitled to all the benefits of
  - such membership.

Section 2. Membership in each local PTA/PTSA shall be open, without
 discrimination, to anyone who believes in and supports the Mission and
 Purposes of the National PTA.

Section 3. Each local PTA/PTSA shall conduct an annual enrollment of members but may admit individuals to membership at any time. Dues submitted to Georgia PTA during the Georgia PTA fiscal/membership year, July 1st - June 30th, are memberships for that current fiscal/membership year.

303 Section 4. Classification. The Georgia PTA shall have the following 304 classifications:

- a. Local Members. Upon meeting the qualifications for membership,
   these individuals are also automatically members of their respective
   state PTA constituent associations and National PTA.
- **b.** Birney Butler State Supporting Donors (State Supporting Donor or 308 Birney Butler Donor). Individuals who are interested in supporting 309 specific programs of the Georgia PTA shall remit donations directly to 310 Georgia PTA at a minimum of \$30. Donating does not constitute 311 membership of Georgia PTA. State Supporting Donors desiring 312 voting privileges at state and local levels must pay dues to a state and 313 local constituent association in good standing. The Birney Butler State 314 Supporting Donor is created by the Board of Directors for the purposes 315 of establishing funding for State PTA programs: Founders' Day, 316 Arts/Reflections and Scholarships. All donations are to be allocated 317 equally amongst these designated programs. 318

Section 5. Annual Dues. Local/State. Each member of a local PTA/PTSA shall pay such annual dues to said association as may be prescribed by the association. The amount of such dues shall include the portion payable to Georgia PTA - the "state portion" - and the portion payable to the National PTA - the "national portion."

- The national portion of each member's dues shall be determined
   by the National PTA.
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   2. The amount of the state portion of each member's dues shall be determined by the Georgia PTA.

Section 6. The amount of the state portion of each member's dues shall be determined by the Georgia PTA. The Georgia PTA portion of each member's dues shall be one dollar and eighty-five cents (\$1.85) per annum. Section 7. The state and national portions of the dues paid by each member of a local PTA/PTSA shall be set aside by the local PTA/PTSA and remitted to the Georgia PTA through such channels and at such times as the state PTA bylaws may provide. Each state PTA shall pay to the National PTA the amount of the national portion of dues paid by all members of local PTAs/PTSAs in its area.

**Section 8.** The Georgia PTA shall make remittances, on a monthly basis, to the National PTA of the amounts due to the National PTA. Each remittance shall be accompanied by a statement of the dues received by the Georgia PTA from all local PTAs/PTSAs within its area for the month covered by the report. Such statement shall show the name and location of each local PTA/PTSA, the amount paid by it to the Georgia PTA, and the number of members in each local PTA/PTSA.

Section 9. The Birney Butler State Supporting Donor is created by the Board of Directors for the purposes of establishing funding for State PTA programs: Founders' Day, Arts/Reflections and Scholarships. All donations are to be allocated equally amongst these designated programs. Individuals who are interested in supporting specific programs of the Georgia PTA shall remit donations directly to Georgia PTA at a minimum of \$30. Donating does not constitute membership of Georgia PTA

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#### **ARTICLE VIII: OFFICERS AND THEIR ELECTION**

**Section 1.** The officers of the Georgia PTA shall be a president, presidentelect, first vice president, second vice president, a secretary, and a treasurer.

Section 2. Except for the office of president, these officers shall be elected
 at the state convention in odd numbered years.

Section 3. The vote shall be conducted by ballot. When there is but one (1) candidate for an office, the ballot for that office may be dispensed with and election held by voice vote at the first general session. A majority vote shall be required for election.

When there are more than two (2) candidates for an office and a majority vote is not achieved on the first ballot, it is necessary to proceed to a second ballot. On the second ballot, a plurality vote shall be required for election. Plurality refers to the greatest number of votes obtained by any one candidate.

- **Section 4.** The following provisions shall govern the qualifications and eligibility of individuals to be officers of the Georgia PTA:
- a.Each officer shall be a member of a local PTA/PTSA chartered by the
   Georgia PTA.
- b.No person is eligible for office who at the time of election, has not served,
- within the previous six (6) years, at least one full term, as a member of the
- 373 Georgia PTA Board of Directors; a member of Georgia PTA Standing
- Committee; or a member of the National PTA Board of Directors; or a member of a National PTA committee elected or otherwise.
- c.Candidates for the office of treasurer must have evidenced experience in
   financial matters, preferably in professional accounting.
- d.Candidates for the office of treasurer, with professional accounting
  experience, would be exempt of eligibility requirements in Article VIII,
  Sect.4, para., b. of these bylaws
- e.No officer may be eligible to serve more than one (1) full term in the same office.
- f. A person who has served in an office for more than one-half (1/2) of a term
  shall be deemed to have served a full term in such office.
- g.No person shall hold more than one (1) state PTA position simultaneously;
   and
- h.Be a natural person who is 18 years of age or older. Georgia Code for
  Non-Profits § 14-3-802
- **Section 5.** Each officer elected at an annual convention shall take office at the close of the election convention and shall serve for a term of two (2) years or until their successor is elected.
- 392 Section 6. Officers Vacancies:
- a. With the exception of the office of president and president-elect, a vacancy in any office may be filled by the Board of Directors as hereinafter provided for the unexpired term. The vote shall be by ballot if more than one candidate for an office is presented. If a ten (10) day notice of the election has been given to the members of the board, a majority vote shall elect otherwise a two-thirds (2/3) vote of members present and voting shall be necessary for election; and
- b. In case of a vacancy in the office of president, the president-elect shall
  become president and shall hold office for the balance of the term. In
  filling the vacancy, the president-elect shall become president and shall
- 403 hold office for the balance of the term. In filling the vacancy, the Georgia PTA Bylaws 12 Amended June 6, 2025

404 president-elect shall be entitled to continue in the presidency for the
405 following term providing not more than one-half (1/2) of a full term as
406 president has been served. A vacancy in the office of president-elect
407 shall be filled at the next convention by the voting body. In the interim,
408 duties of the president-elect shall be delegated by the president.

c. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, the president-elect 409 elected to the 2023-2025 term of office shall continue in the presidency 410 for the 2025-2027 term even if said person has served more than one-411 half of a full term in the office of president during the 2023-2025 term 412 due to a vacancy. The new president-elect elected at the June 2024 413 convention of the voting body shall hold office for the balance of the 414 2023-2025 term and shall continue in the office of president-elect for 415 the 2025-2027 term. The terms of this subsection VIII(6)(c) shall apply 416 only to terms of office for president and president-elect for 2023-2025 417 and 2025-2027, and the process for filling officer vacancies shall 418 otherwise be as set forth in subsections VIII(6)(a) and the new 419 subsection VIII(6)(c) shall be effective until the president and 420 president-elect for the 2027-2029 term are elected, at which time the 421 subsection VIII(6)(c) shall terminate and shall have no further force 422 and effect. 423

424 **Section 7**. There shall be a nominating committee consisting of five (5) 425 members and two (2) alternates who shall be elected by ballot by the Board 426 of Directors from its own body at the summer board meeting.

- 427 a. Election shall be by plurality vote.
- b. The committee shall serve a term of two (2) years.
- c. No person shall be eligible to serve consecutive terms, or any portion
   thereof.
- d. There shall be no more than two committee members from a district.
- e. Vacancies occurring in the nominating committee shall be filled by the
  alternates in order of the number of votes received.
- f. The committee shall meet to elect a chairperson and a vice-chairperson
   and shall report the results of such election prior to the close of the regular
- board meeting at which they were elected.
- 437 **Section 8.** The following shall govern the nominating committee:
- a. The chair of the nominating committee shall direct the state office to
   distribute nomination forms to all qualified
- 439 individuals
- individuals.

- b. The nominating committee shall nominate a candidate for each office to
  be filled and shall send a report of these nominations to the president.
- c. The chairperson of the nominating committee shall report the slate of
   officers to the Board of Directors by the Spring. Board meeting preceding
   the election convention.
- d. The report of the nominating committee shall be included in the call to convention and posted to the Georgia PTA website. The presidents of councils and local units are responsible for informing all qualified individuals of the nominees.
- e. The chair of the nominating committee shall report to the convention at its
  first general session, at which time additional nominations may be made
  from the floor as provided by Georgia PTA's Policy on Elections, as
  stipulated in the Georgia PTA and Policies and Procedures.
- f. The committee shall solicit nomination for chairs of standing committees
   presented y the President-Elect for the next term; and
- g. No later than the second board meeting preceding the election at
  Convention Leadership Training (CLT), present a list of applicants for
  standing committee chairs for the next term to the President-Elect.

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**ARTICLE IX: DUTIES OF OFFICERS** 

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## 462 Section 1. The President shall:

- a. Be the chief executive officer of the association.
- b. Serve as the presiding officer
- c. Present a written strategy plan at Spring BOD meeting prior to conference
- d. Sign and execute all bonds, stock certificates, mortgages, contracts,
   agreements or other obligations in the name of the Georgia PTA as
   authorized by the Board of Directors.
- e. Preside at all annual conventions, meetings of the Board of Directors, the
   Executive Committee, and any other meetings of the Georgia PTA.
- f. Create and appoint special committees as necessary.
- g. Appoint a parliamentarian who shall serve at meetings of the Executive

- j. Approve all communications and materials to be distributed by board
   members in the scope of their PTA work.
- 482 k. Ensure plans of work are followed by reviewing the quarterly reports with
   483 the Executive Committee
- 1. Coordinate the work of the officers and committees.
- Present a written report of the president's activities and a written itemized
  account of the president's expenses at each Board of Directors meeting; and
  m. Perform such other duties as may be provided for by these bylaws,
- m. Perform such other duties as may be provided for by these bylaws, prescribed by the parliamentary authority, or directed by the Board of
- <sup>489</sup> Directors or Executive Committee.
- 490 **Section 2.** The President-Elect shall:
- a. Work in cooperation with the president and fulfill such other duties as may
   be assigned by the president.
- b. Perform the duties of the president in the president's absence or inability to
  act.
- 495 c. Serve as a member of the Finance Committee.
- d. Serve as a member of the Board of Trustees.
- e. Serve as chair of the Governance Committee
- f. Negotiates convention contracts for the two (2) years he/she will serve as
   president. Once the contract is complete, it will be signed by the president.
- g. Attend as a delegate, the National PTA Legislative Conference and theNational PTA Convention.
- h. Present a written report of the president-elect's activities and a written
   itemized account of the president-elect's expenses at each Board of
   Directors meeting.
- i. Register signature on all Georgia PTA financial accounts; and
- j. Perform such other duties as may be provided for by these bylaws,
- 507 prescribed by the parliamentary authority, or directed by the Board of 508 Directors or Executive Committee.
- 509 Section 3. The First Vice President shall:
- 510 a. Act as an aide to the president.
- 511 b.Perform the duties of the president in the absence of the president and the
- <sup>512</sup> president-elect or their inability to act; and

- c. Perform such duties as may be provided for by these bylaws prescribed by
- the parliamentary authority, or directed by the president, the Board of Directors, or the Executive Committee.
- 516 **Section 4.** The Second Vice President shall:
- a. Act as an aide to the president.
- b. Perform the duties of the president in the absence of the president, the
   president-elect, and the first vice president or their inability to act; and
- c. Perform such duties as may be provided for by these bylaws prescribed by
- the parliamentary authority, or directed by the president, the Board of Directors, or the Executive Committee.
- 523 Section 5. The Secretary shall:
- a. Keep an accurate account of all meetings.
- b. Provide Georgia PTA state office with copies of all signed Board
   documents for filing
- c. Be prepared to read the records, or any portion thereof, of any previous
   meetings.
- d. File all records in the state office; and create electronic folders
- e. Perform such duties as may be provided for by these bylaws, prescribed by
- the parliamentary authority, or directed by the president, the Board of Directors, or the Executive Committee.
- 533 **Section 6.** The Treasurer shall:
- a. Maintain a full account of the funds of the Georgia PTA.
- b. Cause to be kept a full and accurate account of the receipts and
   disbursements in books belonging to the Georgia PTA.
- c. Countersign all checks and electronic financial authorizations with the
   president or an officer designated by the president.
- d. Provide a written financial statement at each meeting of the general
   membership, Board of Directors and Executive Committee meeting or
   other times as required.
- e. Present an annual report of the financial condition of the association to the
  body at the annual state convention.
- 544 f. Serve as chairperson of the Finance Committee.
- <sup>545</sup> g. Serve as chairperson of the Board of Trustees; and
- h. Perform such duties as may be provided for by these bylaws, prescribed by
- the parliamentary authority, or directed by the president, president and the
- 548 Executive Committee or the Board of Directors.

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## **ARTICLE X: BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

**Section 1.** The Board of Directors shall: 552

a. Have the authority over the affairs of the Georgia PTA between annual 553 conventions, except those specifically delegated to the Executive 554 Committee, however, it cannot modify bylaws amendments and 555 resolutions adopted by the convention body. 556

- b. Adopt a budget at the beginning of each fiscal year covering estimated 557 income and expenses of the Georgia PTA for the year. 558
- c. Determine such office staff positions as may be needed to carry on the 559 work of the Georgia PTA and shall fix the salaries of such positions; and 560
- d. Amend Policies and Procedures with a two-thirds (2/3) vote by the 561 members present of the Board of Directors. 562
- Section 2. Each board member shall: 563
- a. Be a member of a local PTA/PTSA chartered by the Georgia PTA. 564
- b. Not hold more than one (1) state PTA position simultaneously. 565
- c. Not serve simultaneously as a council or local unit president; and 566
- d. Be a natural person who is 18 years of age or older. 567
- **Section 3.** The members of the board shall be: All elected officers: District 568 directors (ex-officio), Immediate past president of the Georgia PTA (ex-569 officio), Chairpersons of standing committees; Advisor(s) appointed by the 570 President (up to three nonvoting members), and Appointed parliamentarian. 571
- Section 4. After serving one (1) term as the immediate past president, all 572 past presidents shall be eligible to serve on the Georgia PTA Board of 573 Directors in any capacity, except as an officer of the Georgia PTA. 574
- Section 5. A member shall not serve simultaneously as a voting member of 575 the Board of Directors while serving as a paid employee of the Georgia PTA. 576
- Section 6. If a member of the Board of Directors shall at any time cease to 577
- meet the qualifications or fulfill the duties of the position, as specified in 578 these bylaws and the Georgia PTA Policies and Procedures, that person may 579
- be removed from the board by resolution adopted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote 580
- of the Board of Directors. 581
- Section 7. Regular meetings of the board shall be held four (4) times each 582 year, unless otherwise provided by the Board of Directors. 583
- Section 8. Notice of time and place of each regular meeting shall be given at 584
- least thirty (30) days prior to the meeting. Ten (10) days notice shall be 585 given of a change of date.

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587 Section 9. Special meetings of the board may be called by the president or 588 upon the written request of nine (9) members of this board. Five (5) days 589 notice shall be given, with time and date set by the president, not to exceed 590 ten (10) calendar days following receipt of the request.

591 Section 10. At all meetings of the board, a majority of the members of the 592 board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

**Section 11.** Upon the expiration of the term of office or when individuals cease to hold the position that entitles them to be a member of the board, they shall automatically cease to be a member of the board and shall be relieved of all duties and responsibilities incident to such membership. All records, funds, books and other materials pertaining to the position shall be relinquished to the president within fourteen (14) days.

599 Section 12. The Board of Directors shall have authority to make any 600 necessary readjustments in district boundaries.

- 601 Section 13. Georgia PTA board members may serve in any elected non-602 partisan or appointed non-partisan position while serving as a Georgia PTA 603 board member.
- 604 **Section 14.** Perform such other duties as may be provided for by these 605 bylaws, prescribed by the parliamentary authority, or directed by the 606 president, Board of Directors or Executive Committee.
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## **ARTICLE XI: EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE**

- 610 Section 1. There shall be an Executive Committee of the Georgia PTA, the 611 members of which shall be:
- a.All elected officers.
- 613 b.Chairperson of district director's conference.
- 614 c.Chairperson of committee chairperson's conference; and
- 615 d.Appointed parliamentarian.
- 616 Section 2. The Executive Committee shall meet, at a minimum, in 617 conjunction with the regular meetings of the Board of Directors, and in 618 accordance with the calendar approved by the Board of Directors.
- 619 Section 3. Special meetings of the Executive Committee may be called by
- the president or upon written request of three (3) members with five (5) days

notice to each member of the Executive Committee, with time and date set

- by the president, not to exceed ten (10) calendar days following receipt of the
- 623 request.

624 **Section 4.** A majority shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of 625 business.

- 626 **Section 5.** The Executive Committee shall:
- a. Transact business referred to it by the board.
- b.Perform the duties of the Board of Directors between meetings of the
- board, provided no action conflicts with that of the board; meetings may be
   by conference call or a meeting of the body to conduct the business of the
   association;
- 632 c.Act in emergencies between meetings of the Board of Directors.
- d.Make recommendations to the board on matters of policy and administration, including those concerning cooperation with other associations.
- e.Receive plans of work from committee chairs and district directors and
   approve them before their use is authorized; and
- 638 f. Approve a certified public accountant to audit the books of the Georgia 639 PTA.
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#### **ARTICLE XII: STANDING COMMITTEES**

Section 1. Such standing committees may be created by the Board of
Directors as shall be found necessary to carry on the work of this association.
Standing committees shall include, but not limited to, Bylaws, Legislative,
Membership, Family Engagement, Finance, Governance Structure, and
Reflections.

- 648 Section 2. The incoming officers shall elect the standing committee chairs.
- The term for standing committee chairperson shall begin upon their electionand end at the close of the next election convention.
- 651 **Section 3.** The following provisions shall govern the qualifications and 652 eligibility of persons to be state standing committee chairpersons:
- a. Only a member of a local PTA/PTSA within Georgia shall be eligible to
   serve.
- b. No person shall serve more than two (2) consecutive full terms in the same
- position with the exception of the Legislative Chair who may serve threefull terms.
- c. A person who has served more than one-half (1/2) term shall be credited
   with having served a complete term; and

- d. Only those persons who have given their consent to serve, if elected, shall
   be nominated.
- 662 Section 4. Duties of the standing committee chairpersons shall be:
- a. To submit a plan of work to the Executive Committee; and
- 664 b.To carry out the plans of work of their committee as approved by the 665 Executive Committee.
- 666 **Section 5.** Standing Committee vacancies:
- a. If a vacancy occurs in a chairpersonship, the duties may be performed by a
   member of the board appointed by the president until the vacancy is filled
   as provided in these bylaws; and
- b. A vacancy in a standing committee chairpersonship may be filled at any
  board meeting provided ten (10) days notice has been given. If notice has
  not been given, the Board of Directors shall elect a committee of three
  members, no two from the same district, to submit nominations to fill the
  vacancy at their first meeting after the vacancy occurs. Voting for the
  nominees shall be by ballot if there is more than one nominee. The
  nominee receiving the majority of the votes cast shall be elected.
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## **ARTICLE XIII: DISTRICTS**

- 680 Section 1. The state shall be divided into districts, the number and 681 boundaries determined by the Board of Directors. All members of local 682 PTAs/PTSAs within the boundaries of each district shall constitute the 683 district membership.
- 684 Section 2. A district shall operate under the Georgia PTA Bylaws and under
- standing rules reviewed by the Georgia PTA bylaws committee and approved
  by the Board of Directors.
- 687 Section 3. A district may not legislate for local PTAs/PTSAs or councils.
- 688 **Section 4.** The district directors shall promote the work of the Georgia PTA 689 in their respective districts and shall hold district conferences as required in 690 the district standing rules, preferably in the fall and apring
- 690 the district standing rules, preferably in the fall and spring.
- 691 Section 5. In order to be eligible to serve as a district officer, you must
- reside and be a member of a local PTA/PTSA within the district. A district
- 693 director shall have served at least one term as a local unit officer or council
- <sup>694</sup> officer, prior to being elected or appointed.
- 695 Section 6. The following rules shall govern the election of district directors:

696	a. The members of each PTA district shall elect a district director at its
697	Spring conference. The term shall begin at the close of convention.
698	b. District directors shall be elected for a two-year (2) term. They shall be
699	ineligible to serve for more than two (2) terms and shall serve only one
700	year as an appointed director; and
701	c. If a vacancy should occur and cannot be filled according to the district
702	standing rules, the president shall have the authority to appoint a district
703	director for a period not to exceed one (1) year.
704 705	<b>ARTICLE XIV: COUNCILS</b>
705	ANTICLE AIV: COUNCILS
707	Section 1. Councils shall be composed of three (3) or more PTA/PTSA units
708	organized in cities, counties, or communities for the purpose of conference
709	and cooperation in matters of common interests.
710	a. Only PTAs/PTSAs in good standing with the Georgia PTA shall be
711	members of a council.
712	b. Only PTAs/PTSAs in good standing shall have the right to make motions,
713	debate and vote.
714	c. Each council shall be governed by bylaws approved by the Georgia PTA.
715	A council in good standing is one that:
716	a. Adheres to the purposes and basic policies of the PTA.
717	b. Adheres to the Georgia PTA Standards of Affiliation, as prescribed
718	Georgia PTA Board of Directors; and
719	b. Has bylaws approved according to the procedures of the Georgia PTA;
720	Is incorporated.
721	<b>Section 2.</b> Each council in good standing shall be entitled to be represented
722	at the annual state convention by its president and one (1) other officer, or their alternates, and one (1) additional delegate for each ten (10) local units
723 724	or major fraction thereof in council membership, the delegates to be elected
724	by the Executive Committee or in open session.
726	Section 3. The bylaws of each council shall include an article stating the
727	fiscal year.
728	Section 4. Each council shall include in its bylaws provisions corresponding
729	to the provisions of such of the National PTA Bylaws.
730	Section 5. Each council shall include in its bylaws provisions corresponding
731	to the provisions of the Georgia PTA Bylaws identified by a number symbol.

- 732 Section 6. The adoption of an amendment to any provisions of these bylaws
- identified by a number symbol shall automatically amend the bylaws of the
- council to conform to the action taken by the state convention.
- 735 Section 7. Amendments to bylaws:
- a.Council bylaws may be amended at any regular meeting of the council by a
- two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present and voting, provided that notice of the proposed amendment shall have been given at least thirty (30)

notice of the proposed amendment shall have been given at least thirty (30)

- days prior to the meeting of the council and that the amendment shall besubject to approval of the Georgia PTA.
- b.The amendment shall become effective upon receipt of approval from theGeorgia PTA; and
- c. In the event that a revised set of bylaws is required by the Georgia PTA
   and there are no changes in the council information stated in the current
   bylaws, the thirty (30) day waiting period is waived.
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## **ARTICLE XV: STATE AND LOCAL RELATIONSHIPS**

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Section 1. The Georgia PTA is responsible for compliance by the local
 PTAs/PTSAs and councils within its area with the National PTA Bylaws,
 Georgia PTA Bylaws and their own bylaws.

752 Section 2. The Executive Committee shall be the committee on state and
 753 local relationships:

- a. The Executive Committee shall review any alleged violations by local
  PTAs/PTSAs or councils of the National PTA Bylaws, of these bylaws, or
  their own bylaws or other practices or activities of local PTAs/PTSAs and
  councils that may tend to affect the Purposes and Basic Policies of the
  Georgia PTA or the National PTA that cannot be resolved at the local unit,
  council, or district executive board levels, after all disciplinary options
  have been exhausted at those levels. The Executive Committee shall
- report its recommendations to the Board of Directors; and
- b. The Board of Directors shall give due consideration to the report of the
  Executive Committee and shall accord the local PTA/PTSA or council an
  opportunity to be heard and to respond. If, upon such consideration, the
  Board of Directors finds a violation by the local PTA/PTSA or council, it
  shall by two-thirds (2/3) vote, require the local PTA/PTSA or council to
  take appropriate action within a time stipulated by the Board of Directors.
  If the local PTA/PTSA or council fails to comply with the recommended

actions, the Board of Directors may withdraw its status as a unit of theGeorgia PTA and the National PTA.

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#### **#ARTICLE XVI: DISCIPLINARY ACTION**

Georgia PTA has established policies and procedures to be followed by all its
members and PTA constituents when allegations, of a violation of PTA
Bylaws, policies, procedures or conduct that is injurious to the association,
are made against any member, group of members, unit, council, district or
state. (See Georgia PTA Disciplinary Code and Procedures (provided with
each constituent's bylaws) or other disciplinary documents as prescribed by
Georgia PTA Board of Directors).

**ARTICLE XVII: STATE CONVENTION** 

Section 1. The Georgia PTA shall meet in annual convention at a time and place designated by the Board of Directors. A notice of the convention shall be sent by the state office at the direction of the president to each member of the Board of Directors and to each local unit and council president at least forty-five (45) days prior to convention.

Section 2. The annual convention shall be the governing body of the
 Georgia PTA in all matters not previously determined by official action of
 the National PTA.

- 794 **Section 3.** Representation at state convention:
- a. Each local association in good standing\* shall be entitled to be represented
  at the annual state convention by its president and one (1) other officer, or
  their alternates, and one (1) delegate for every fifty (50) paid members
  recorded in the state office as of the tenth (10<sup>th</sup>) day of April each year.
- b. Newly chartered and reinstated local associations which have come into
   membership with Georgia PTA after the tenth (10<sup>th</sup>) day of April, shall be
   entitled to the same ratio of representation as other local associations.
- c. Each council in good standing<sup>\*</sup> shall be entitled to be represented at the
  annual state convention by its president and one (1) other officer, or their
  alternates, and one (1) delegate for each ten (10) local units in good
  standing with the Georgia PTA or major fraction thereof in council

membership, the delegates and alternates to be elected by the Executive
Committee or in open session.

Section 4. The annual convention shall be open to all members of the 808 Georgia PTA and visitors upon payment of the required registration fee, 809 which shall be determined by the Board of Directors, but the privilege of 810 making motions, debating, and voting shall be limited to members of the 811 Board of Directors, past presidents of the Georgia PTA, presidents of 812 councils and one (1) other officer, or their alternates, to be elected by the 813 Executive Committee or in open session, presidents and one (1) other officer 814 of local units or their alternates, and accredited delegates from councils and 815 local PTA/PTSA units. A voting member shall have but one (1) vote. 816

Section 5. One hundred (100) voting members present at any regular
 convention, representing a majority of the districts, shall constitute a quorum.

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#### **ARTICLE XVIII: CANCELLATION OF CONVENTION**

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#### Section 1. In the event of a state or national emergency, such as war, epidemic, or disaster, the convention may be cancelled. If cancelled in an election year, current officers would continue to serve until the emergency is past and a convention can be held.

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#### **ARTICLE XIX: NATIONAL CONVENTION**

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834 Section 1. The Georgia PTA shall be entitled to accredit to the annual 835 convention as its delegates:

- a. The president of the Georgia PTA; and
- b. One additional delegate from among the members of the state PTA for each one thousand members, or major fraction thereof, of the Georgia
- PTA, as shown on the books of the treasurer of the National PTA as of
- 840 March 31 preceding the annual convention.

Section 2. Delegates and their alternates receiving state PTA funds to attend
a National PTA convention shall be selected by the president and approved
by the Board of Directors at a regular board meeting.

Section 3. In the event of the absence of the president of the Georgia PTA at
the convention of the National PTA, the Georgia PTA shall be represented
by the president-elect.

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#### **ARTICLE XX: STATE OFFICE**

<sup>848</sup> 849 **Section 1.** There shall be an established state office.

**Section 2.** The state office shall be under the general supervision of the president of the Georgia PTA. The Board of Directors may determine such positions as may be needed to carry on the work of the Georgia PTA and shall determine and approve the salaries of such positions. All office employees shall work under the direction of the Office Manager.

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## **ARTICLE XXI: ENDOWMENT FUND**

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Section 1. The Georgia PTA shall maintain an endowment fund, known as 858 the Alice McLellan Birney Endowment Fund, which is held and 859 administered separately from the funds of the Georgia Congress of Parents 860 and Teachers, Inc. The administration of the Alice McLellan Birney 861 Endowment Fund (hereinafter referred to as "the Endowment Fund") shall be 862 under the direction of a Board of Trustees to be invested as the trustees are 863 allowed according to the Investment Policy approved by the Board of 864 Directors. 865

Section 2. The purpose of the Alice McLellan Birney Endowment Fund
shall be to:

- a. Provide for capital repairs or improvements to the physical building of
   Georgia PTA.
- b. Provide for furniture, fixtures, and equipment for the physical
  building(s)/office(s) of Georgia PTA; and
- c. Cover costs associated with expenses of having a Georgia PTA office as
   budgeted.
- 874 Section 3. The Board of Trustees shall be composed of seven (7) trustees.
- 875 The Board of Directors shall govern the selection, vacancies, and removal of
- the seven (7) trustees of the Endowment Fund.

- a.One (1) of the trustees shall be the treasurer of the Georgia PTA, who shall
  serve as chairperson of the Board of Trustees.
- b.Two (2) additional trustees who shall be known as Director Trustees shall

be elected by the Board of Directors from among its members for a two (2)
 year term at the first regular board meeting following the election

- convention. Director Trustees shall serve only as long as they are members of the Board of Directors and may not serve more than two (2)
- terms.
- c. Two (2) of the trustees shall be known as PTA Member Trustees and must
   be members of the Georgia PTA but not members of the Board of Directors
- of the Georgia PTA. Member Trustees shall be elected for a two (2) year
  term following the election convention.
- d.The president of the Georgia PTA shall serve as a member of the Board of
   Trustees.
- e. The president-elect of the Georgia PTA shall serve as a member of the
  Board of Trustees.
- f. Any trustee may be removed at any time for just cause by a two-thirds
  (2/3) vote of the Georgia PTA Board of Directors; and
- g.The Georgia PTA Board of Directors shall fill any vacancy occurring in the
  Board of Trustees.
- Section 4. The corpus of the Endowment Fund shall be set at a minimum of \$100,000, leaving interest as operating capital. However, upon a majority vote of the Board of Trustees and the Board of Directors, the minimum amount of the corpus may be changed:
- a. The operating capital is available to the Georgia PTA to maintain a state
- office, subject to the budget presented by the Finance Committee,
  reviewed by the Board of Trustees, and approved by the Board of Directors
  to ensure capital can support expenses.
- b. The title of any property owned shall be vested in the Georgia Congress of
  Parents and Teachers, Inc.; and
- c. A complete report of the Endowment fund, including investments and
   expenditures, shall be given at each official meeting of the Board of
   Directors, and an annual report shall be given at the state convention.
- 910 Section 5. In the event it becomes necessary or desirable to buy or sell any
- real property on the behalf of the Georgia PTA, the Board of Directors will
- have the authority to take the necessary action with the approval of the Board

of Trustees. The funds from the sale of any real property shall then be made
a part of the Endowment Fund.

- Section 6. Local unit PTAs/PTSAs, councils, districts or individuals may
  make donations in any amount to the Endowment Fund.
- Section 7. Local unit PTAs/PTSAs, councils, districts or individuals may
  honor an individual with a Georgia PTA Founders Certificate upon payment
  of one hundred (\$100.00) to the Endowment Fund.
- Section 8. Local unit PTAs/PTSAs, councils, districts or individuals may
  honor an individual with an Honorary Georgia PTA Life Achievement
  Award upon payment of twenty-five (\$25.00) to the Endowment Fund.
- Section 9. Local unit PTAs/PTSAs, councils, districts or individuals may
  honor the memory of a deceased member who has made significant
  contributions to PTA by contributing twenty-five (\$25.00) to the Endowment
  Fund as a memorial.
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## **ARTICLE XXII: FISCAL YEAR**

The fiscal year of the Georgia PTA shall begin on July 1 and end on the following June 30.

- ARTICLE XXIII: ELECTRONIC MEETINGS and COMMUNICATION
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  936 Section 1. Meetings: The Georgia PTA Board of Directors, Executive
  937 Committee and all other committees and subcommittees shall be authorized
  938 to meet and conduct business, including voting, by conference call,
- teleconference or other electronic communications media, as permitted by
  applicable law. Votes cannot be cast by email.
- Section 2. Communication: Unless members indicate otherwise to Georgia
  PTA State Office, all communication required by these bylaws, including
  meeting notices, may be sent electronically unless otherwise specified in
  these bylaws.
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#### **ARTICLE XXIV: PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY**

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<sup>948</sup> The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly <sup>949</sup> Revised shall govern the Georgia PTA and its constituent associations in all cases in which they are applicable and in which they are not in conflict with
these bylaws, the National PTA Bylaws, or the articles of incorporation.

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## **ARTICLE XXV: AMENDMENTS**

Section 1. These bylaws may be amended at an annual convention by a twothirds (2/3) vote of those present and voting, provided the amendments have been approved by the Board of Directors and notice of proposed amendments has been provided to constituent associations forty-five (45) days prior to the opening of convention.

Section 2. The adoption of an amendment to any provision of the National PTA Bylaws shall serve automatically and without the requirement of further action by the Georgia PTA to amend their corresponding bylaws. State PTAs shall promptly incorporate such amendments in their respective bylaws.

**Section 3.** The adoption of an amendment to any provision of these bylaws identified by a number symbol (#) shall serve automatically to amend the bylaws of the local units and councils to conform to the action taken by the state convention.

Section 4. The Executive Committee or the Board of Directors by a majority
vote may authorize the committee on bylaws to submit a revised set of
bylaws as a substitute for the existing bylaws.

Section 5. Amendments or a revision of the Georgia PTA Bylaws shall be
submitted to the National PTA within fifteen (15) days following the annual
convention at which they are amended.

Section 6. Updated bylaws shall be posted on the Georgia PTA website,
and/or by other electronic means as the Board of Directors may designate,
within thirty (30) days following the annual convention at which they are
amended.
